

## **ENROLMENT TO PREP PROGRAM**

Our Primary Religious Education Program follows the guidelines by the Archbishops office. This program is designed to support Parents' in the faith development of their child. Our role as Catechists is to help you, as parents to keep the promise you made to God when your child was Baptised to raise them in the Catholic faith. We will lead the children in their learning about the Catechism of the Catholic church and the Liturgy of the Mass.

## **COMMITMENT TO PREP PROGRAM**

When you enrol your child into the PREP program it means:

1. Your child is required to commit to attend classes every week for 3 and a half terms
2. Parents are to support their child's learning by reviewing and discussing the work completed in their files
3. Attend PREP Masses as a community
4. Follow the safety guide lines
5. Attend Mass regularly

## **COMMITMENT TO SACRAMENT PROGRAM**

When you enrol your child into a sacramental program ie. Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation it means:

1. Parents need to attend the Sacrament Parent Talk
2. Parents and candidate need to attend the Sacrament Enrolment weekend to collect an enrolment form ( which is different to the PREP enrolment form)
3. Paying the fees and enrolling you child in a Sacrament program requires candidates and parents to attend

2. PARENT & CHILD WORKSHOP
3. RETREAT
4. REHEARSAL
5. GO TO RECONCILIATION BEFORE RECEIVING FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION
6. SACRAMENT MASS HELD IN PARISH
7. CERTIFICATE MASS
8. ATTEND MASS REGULARLY IN PREPARATION TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT
